UNDERAGE DRINKING PREVENTION

877 Means 21







One of the issues with underage drinking is that stores selling to minors and house parties with underage drinking often go unreported. The Coalition's answer was to establish the 877 MEANS21 tip line, where community members can do just that. In addition, the Coalition was able to pass a county ordinance, which has been adopted by many municipalities, (most recently, Delray Beach and Boca Raton) requiring signage at alcohol outlets. The signs act as a reminder of the law. The signs require the displaying of the current legal age to purchase alcohol, a consequence of selling to or buying for those under 21, and a number to call and report those who do. The signs were distributed to over 2,900 alcohol outlets in Palm Beach County, which of course had our 877 MEANS21 tip line as the number to call. The results have been outstanding so far, with community members reporting parties and stores selling minors. If your community hasn't adopted this ordinance yet, please work with us to make it happen. This has been a valuable tool.

85 x 18

We launched our 80x18 campaign in 2015 with hopes that by 2018, 80% of PBC teens would report not drinking. Well thanks to everyones prevention efforts we reached our goal two years early. That's right, 80% of teens reported not drinking on the last Florida Youth Substance Abuse survey.

So we have upped the game and are now going for 85%.

It will take all of us to reach this goal.

UNDERAGE DRINKING PREVENTION

School Bus Poster Contest

"Your Future is Bright With Alcohol Out of Sight" marked last year's theme for the Annual Alcohol Prevention Poster Contest. This project started from two middle school students who wanted to get their message out to a wider audience. Without any prior ads on the inside of school buses, they knew this was the way to go!

Today, after receiving nearly 7,000 entries over the years, this positive prevention campaign has become part of the fabric of the Palm Beach County community. Students from elementary through high school are eligible to enter. Each year, our guest artist judges select the top nominees from all entries received and approximately 5,000 community members vote online for their favorite to be reprinted and posted inside all School District of Palm Beach school buses. Generous contributions from Hanley Foundation and the Judy Carreras Foundation has allowed the project to award two students each year with \$1,000.

Thanks to the commitment of the South Florida Fair, we feature the top 100 entries from the campaign at a booth each year where over 1,500 patrons view the prevention messages. After the winning posters are printed, 100 volunteers post over 2,000 prevention posters inside approximately 1,000 school buses.

With our continued sponsorships, including Palm Beach Sherriff's Office, Wellington Rotary, partnerships such as Florida SADD and Florida MADD, volunteers and others, this campaign touches over 66,000 students daily who ride the school bus.







OPIOID PREVENTION

Throughout the year the Coalition has partnered with various organizations to to provide trainings and bring awareness to the opioid epidemic. This includes creating a Drug Trends report which can be found on our main web page as well as our DontBeAGuineaPig.org site

Working with Bethesda Hospital and Jupiter Medical Center, we trained over 100 doctors, nurses and medical staff on proper prescribing methods and alternatives to opioids.



Using an evidenced base Over the Counter Medicine Safety program. Our Teen Coalition in Action members educated over 50 elementary and middle school students on medicine safety and Rx Drop box program.



The Coalition staff provided community trainings and disseminated information all over the county. Providing community members valuable information about opioid use prevention, intervention and treatment options.

RX DRUG PREVENTION

Drop Box Program

By continuously working with our law enforcement partners and Solid Waste Authority, we were able to increase the number of prescription drop boxes in Palm Beach County to 30 locations.

Partnering with Publix, Walgreens and the PBC Board of Pharmacists, we continued to display signage at a number of pharmacies and community locations throughout the county.


Special thanks goes to Walgreens for purchasing 5,000 flyers for distribution in their stores and the community. More importantly, setting up drop boxes in some of their stores.

Our efforts are paying off and the results are outstanding:

- Over 8,000 lbs. of prescription drugs collected each year
- Over 6,000 unique visitors to the www.pbcdrop.org website annually where thousands are educated on proper storage and disposal of prescription drugs

The Coalition on Wheels (better known as the COW), is our mobile prevention truck and trailer that can be seen out and about at numerous local community festivals and trainings. This is our time to meet and greet our awesome community members where they live, and it allows us to reach the underserved areas of our county. Staff and volunteers put our strategies into action by bringing drug prevention to life with interactive information and hands on activities at COW events. 
Youth Summits

Part of our mission is to provide drug prevention education and advocacy skills to the young people in our community. Hosting Youth Summits is one way we address the topics of alcohol, marijuana, prescription drugs and others.

Impacting over 500 middle and high school students yearly, our Teen Coalition in Action (TCIA) members are actively engaged in the design and implementation of many of our county youth summits. For our Fall Youth Summit, #NotMyBrain, youth from 6th - 12th grade were invited to build their skills in leadership, team building, advocacy and media message development. Led by TCIA, they took their peers on a day adventure where teens met other teens from around the county, they taught peer to peer workshops on the "Truth About Alcohol and Marijuana", learned how to market a prevention message and finished the day off with the creation and viewing of their own PSA.


Jointly during our youth summits, we offer a Parent Café so parents of the participating teens can learn drug prevention and communication skills too. Thank you to our partners, MADD and Hanley Foundation for offering these crucial workshops with us.

With collaboration from partners like PBSO, Urban League, Palm Beach County School District, Choice to Change, Planned Parenthood, West Palm Beach Police Department and Southeast Behavioral Health Network and many others, we are able to reach a broad spectrum of the community.



GraduationHats off to the Class of 2017!

This once in a life time event for the 2017 Seniors of Palm Beach County School District (PBCSD) draws over 20,000 people to celebrate their achievement. With support from PBCSD, the Coalition shared prevention messaging with the seniors, encouraging them to maintain a healthy, alcohol and other drug free life. We also, reminded parents to steer clear of providing alcohol to those under 21.



Prom

The Drug Abuse Treatment Association (DATA), took the lead with the Coalition on our Prom Promise campaign.

This unique environmental strategy has middle school students sending their high school prom going cohorts a self-made, hand written message and drawing that tells them the importance of staying safe and sober. Cards are given to prom goers when they receive their prom ticket and displayed in prominent hallways for all to see. High school students tell us how special it is to receive this personal message because it reminds them that their choices matter and can influence those younger than them for the better or worse.



SBIRT



Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) is an evidence-based practice used to identify, reduce, and prevent problematic use, abuse, and dependence on alcohol and illicit drugs.

SBIRT is an approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment to people with substance use disorders and those at risk of developing these disorders. Working with community partners such as DATA, we have screened hundreds of youth and based on their risk assessment, connected them with the proper services.

Strengthening Families Dinner

Family Day is a national movement to celebrate parental engagement as an effective tool to help keep America's kids substance free. The Palm Beach County Substance Awareness Coalition is supporting this effort by engaging our community partners such as the Bethel Evangelical Baptist Church, Propel, Healthy Delray Beach and so many more to participate in our Annual Strengthening Family Dinners.

This year we had 5 Strengthening Dinners

Attendees took a pledge to show the importance of family dinners and took home some great conversation starters.



Overall, 90% of businesses were in compliance compared to the 47% of businesses in 2014. The Coalitions efforts to increase compliance checks, provide Responsible Beverage Server trainings and implementing point of purchase signage ordinances has played a large role in the decrease of stores and other outlets selling alcohol to those under 21, these efforts led to improvements in our local compliance rate.



Compliance Checks

In partnership with the North Palm Beach PD, West Palm Beach PD, and Palm Beach Sheriff's Office, 289 alcohol compliance checks were conducted in Fiscal Year 2016. These checks were conducted by law enforcement personnel trained by PBCSAC.



TCIA

This group has grown in numbers and strength over the last few years. Currently, membership spans across 12 middle and high schools. Keeping with their mission to inspire and empower 100% of Palm Beach County teens to be alcohol and other drug free, they utilize a strategic plan to address several areas of concern, such as the prevention of marijuana, underage drinking, and prescription drug misuse.

They have designed and implemented a Town Hall, Youth Summits, and alternative events to engage teens in substance free fun, such as their inaugural Spring Break Bright Night. They have been invited to share their message on a iHeart Radio broadcast and can be seen spreading their message at community events.

Led by Jonah Fisher, they passed the Point of Purchase Ordinance for the cities of Boca Raton and Delray Beach. This ordinance is aimed at the preventing the buying, giving and selling of alcohol to anyone underage.

Teens are trained to deliver workshops on the Truth About Marijuana and Alcohol and Over the Counter Medication Safety to their peers or other community groups. Last year, they delivered programs to over 350 local students.

TCIA Attends National Youth Leadership Institute

With the generous support of members like you, Domonique Lee and Chloe Calderon, had the privilege of attending CADCA's National Youth Leadership Institute in Las Vegas. Not only did they receive intensive training on proven strategies to address drug prevention in our community, but also to be instructors of the evidenced based curriculum, Over the Counter Medication Safety. This program is now being offered to 5 – 8th graders in our community.

PBCSAC was privileged to celebrate the incredible work our community partners and volunteers do every day at the fourth annual Awards Luncheon. The work of the coalition depends on the commitment of these leaders.






NOT MY BRAIN

A new messaging campaign, Not My Brain empowers teens and young adults by educating them about the short and long term damage, early drug and alcohol use can have on their brains. #NotMyBrain and the NotMy Brain.com web site have been set up to inform community youth about the effects of certain drugs and alcohol on the developing brain and empower them to resist external pressures.

NOT MY HOUSE

Some parents have the attitude, that letting teens drink under their roof is "safe drinking", but when it comes to teens, there is no safe drinking.

In fact, studies have proven that allowing your teen to drink under your roof has the reverse effect. Teens who are allowed to drink at home are more likely to drink outside their home. Also, if you think all teens drink, you'd be wrong again. In fact, 80% of Palm Beach County teens reported NOT drinking on a recent survey.

In addition, assuming you are willing to take the legal risks, providing alcohol to other teens without their parents' permission is not only against the law, is also against the beliefs of the majority of parents.



Teen drinking is the cause of a series of adverse effects including: motor vehicle crashes, risky sexual behaviors; accidental deaths; decreased school performance; brain impairment; economic costs to communities, and more.

The Not My House campaign was set up to inform and educate parents about underage drinking and provide a platform for parents to feel safe about allowing their teen to attend a party, knowing that the host parent has taken the pledge to not allow underage drinking in their home.


